MEASLES IMMUNISATION

Is your child fully immunised against measles? Do we have a copy of their immunisation status on our files?

The office recently sent home an email to everyone that we DO NOT have records for - please check your spam mail, just in case it has gone there?

If there is an outbreak at our kura, anyone considered to be a close contact (that cannot prove they have been fully immunised against measles), may be required by Public Health directive to quarantine at home.

YEARS 1 - 3 FUNDAMENTALS DISPLAY

On Tuesday the 25th of November, parents/caregivers/supporters are invited to our FUNdamentals morning. Thursday the 27th of November, will be the postponement date. This is a morning dedicated to fundamental movement skills (FMS), which are the basic building blocks of all physical activity and sports, such as running, jumping, and throwing. 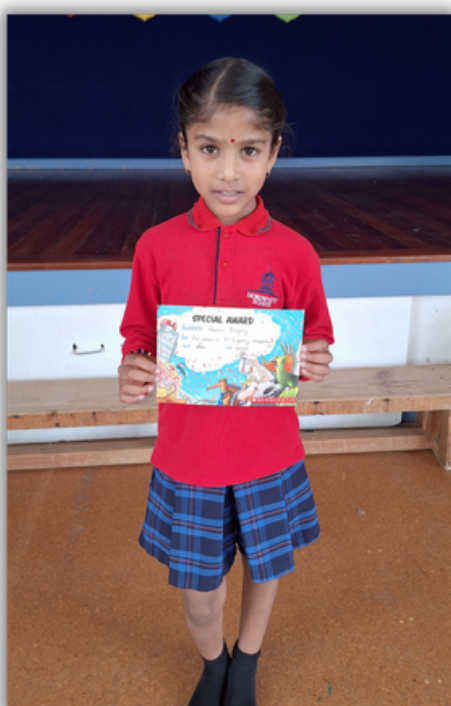

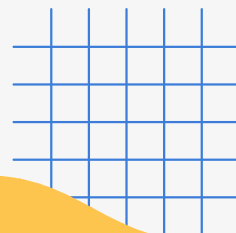
CALENDAR ART/DIARIES

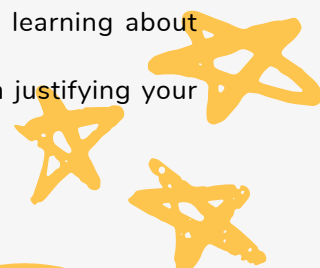

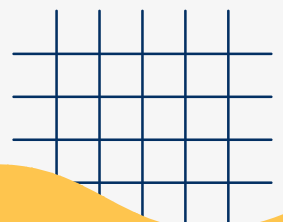
Measles in Manawatū - advice from Health NZ

As you may be aware, there have been confirmed cases of measles in our community. We are asking your support in sharing these important messages with whānau.

- Check that everyone in your family born after 1 Jan 1969 has had two doses of measles vaccines after the age of 12 months
- Call 0800 282 926 or visit info.health.nz/measles to check your immunisation status or to book your vaccine
- If you have any queries about measles, please call Healthline 0800 611 116
- If you think you have measles, stay at home and call Healthline immediately

IMPORTANT

Emails have been sent to families that have not yet provided confirmation of immunisation. Ministry of Health guidelines state that proof of immunisation status is required to avoid needing to quarantine at home in the event of a measles outbreak at school.
